




IMGs are essential to U.S. health care

International medical graduates (IMGs) are physicians, both U.S. citizens and non-U.S. citizens, who received their basic medical degree from a medical school outside the United States. These internationally trained physicians are essential to our ability to provide accessible, high-quality health care to U.S. patients. IMGs provide care in every U.S. state and serve in high numbers in underserved areas—both rural and urban—and in primary-care specialties.


Performance in the 2026 Main Residency Match[®]

IMGs accounted for approximately **23.6%** of all matched applicants, filling critical roles across high-need specialties.
